



Summary

Very good overall as elaborately embellished with Mexican origins. Retaining over 50% blue niter along with over 75% silver and gold inlay finishes with smooth grey and brown patina on the balance, enhanced markings, light handling wear, along with well-defined engraving and inlays. Mechanically Excellent

Floral engravings traditionally native to Mexican culture, Dahlias, Marigolds, Poppy and Roses/Rosebuds represented as resilience and endurance, political struggle and violence with Dahlias representative of Lady of Guadalupe (*Virgin Mary*).

The grips are Mexican Charro/Tiffany Style Grips excellent with an attractively antiqued appearance, only the slightest handling marks and crisp relief. Along with depictions of the Rampant Colt and Mexican Coat of Arms (*of the era circa 1893-1916*) inlaid in gold on both panels.

Description/ About the Engraver

Manufactured in 1907, subsequently extensively and elaborately embellished by an unknown skilled artisan. It features floral bud and leaf motif engraving spanning across the barrel, ejector rod housing, frame, cylinder, and both grip straps, with the floral motifs on the barrel, frame, cylinder and grips straps inlaid in silver along with gold inlaid birds, contrasted with a niter blue finish. It has fixed blade front and top strap notch rear sights, the Colt Hartford address in two lines on top of the barrel with the caliber designation retained on the left side, the two-line patent dates retained on the left side of the frame, along with a triangle "VP" factory proof and "T" on the left side of the trigger guard.

Matching full serial numbers on the frame, trigger guard, and butt, along with the assembly number "1838" on the rear of the loading gate.
